Families First – assessment numbers





Family First Assessments (FFAs) are used to identify support for families who agree to multi-agency early help.



The number of FFAs undertaken across Hertfordshire has reduced over the last two years. 761 assessments were finalised in the last 12 months, which included 1,833 children. 71.8% of children supported are White British. 5.2% of children had an EHCP.



Intensive Family Support teams (341) and schools / school partnerships (230) led on the majority of FFAs.



Between July 2021 and June 2022, 1,385 children were supported using 'short term work' interventions. During the Spring term, Local School Partnerships worked with 797 cases (outside of FFAs), compared to 1,503 in the Autumn term. Family Centres provided targeted support to 2,016 families using the Family Centre workflow between April 2021 and March 2022.

Presenting needs and outcomes





90% of FFAs include at least one member of the family with a mental health and / or an emotional wellbeing need. Over 60% of FFAs include issues about domestic abuse & family conflict, education (attendance issues / exclusions) and other health & wellbeing.



The most frequently recorded primary needs for children are unmet mental health / emotional wellbeing needs, family relationships & behaviour.




The outcome success rate following the completion of FFAs for the period between July 2021 and June 2022 was 72%. 13% of families disengaged or withdrew consent; however it is often found that much has been achieved prior to disengagement. 15% of FFAs result in cases transferred to LCS for support from Specialist & Safeguarding Services.






Local School Partnerships (Spring Term 2022)








Hertfordshire has 17 Local Schools Partnerships (LSP) supporting 532 schools; 427 of these schools buy into services provided by an LSP. During the Spring term, LSPs worked with **797** cases, compared to **1503** in the Autumn term. However, more support was provided on a face to face basis. 70% of referrals are from schools. The needs most requiring support relate to mental health / emotional wellbeing, parenting skills, behaviour and SEND.



(county increase from 1.9% - 2.6% between March 2020 & June 2022)




Watford has the highest claimant count rate, as of June 2022, at 3.5%; the lowest is East Herts at 1.8%. The Hertfordshire rate for 18-24 year olds is 3.2% (June 2022); this was 2.7% in March 2020.

By District






In addition to the NEET rate falling from 2.4% to 1.9% in the last 12 months, the in-learning rate has fell marginally during the same period from 94.3% to 94.0%. The lost contact rose from 0.9% in 1.4%. NEET rates for our vulnerable groups are significantly higher, hence the investment in initiatives for targeted support.

Fuel poverty is the problem faced by households living on a low income in a home which cannot be kept warm at reasonable cost. Estimates of the number of households in fuel poverty are published annually by the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS).

A new fuel poverty metric Low Income Low Energy Efficiency (LILEE) was set out in the <u>Fuel Poverty Sustainable Warmth strategy published in February 2021</u> (opens in a new window). The LILEE indicator considers a household to be fuel poor if:

- it is living in a property with an energy efficiency rating of band D, E, F or G as determined by the most up-to-date Fuel Poverty Energy Efficiency Rating (FPEER) Methodology; and
- its disposable income (income after housing costs (AHC) and energy needs) would be below the poverty line.

Fuel poverty statistics are based on data from the English Housing Survey (EHS). Given the sample size of the EHS (11,974 households in the combined 2018/19 and 2019/20 dataset), it is not possible to reliably estimate fuel poverty levels in small geographical areas, such as Local Authorities, without the use of modelling.
