## Hertfordshire July 2023 – June 2024

Family First Assessments (FFAs) are used to identify support for families who agree to multi-agency early help.



The number of FFAs finalised in the 12 months to the end of June 2024 was 762, which included 1,805 children. 27.2% of children supported are non-White British. 9.6% of children aged 5-17 had an EHCP and 11.1% have a SEND support status.



Intensive Family Support teams (453), school partnerships (98) and schools (95) led on the majority of FFAs.



Between July 2023 and June 2024, 1,652 children were supported using 'short term work' interventions.





80% of FFAs include at least one child / young person member of the family with a health need and 79% identified an adult with a health need. 77% identify a need against the Family Relationships criteria and 72% of FFAs include concerns relating to education.




The outcome success rate following the completion of FFAs for the period between July 2023 and June 2024 was 75%. 12% of families disengaged or withdrew consent; however, it is often found that much has been achieved prior to disengagement. 13% of FFAs result in cases transferred to LCS for support from Specialist & Safeguarding Services.



## Presenting needs % (family level) in completed FFAs







#### **Children & young People by District / Borough**






### Short Term Work June 2023- June 2024 (exc. cancelled forms)

#### Children & young People by lead agency






## **Claimant count % (not seasonally adjusted)**



**By District – June 2021 – July 2024** 



Watford has the highest claimant count rate, as of July 2024, at 4.5%; East Herts has the lowest rate at 2.1%. The Hertfordshire rate for 18-24 year olds is 4.0% (July 2024); this was 6.4% in June 2021.

## **By District**





In addition to the NEET rate increasing from 2.28% to 2.66% in the last 12 months, the in-learning rate has fallen during the same period from 93.35% to 92.69%. The lost contact rate has risen from 1.48% to 1.93% between June 2023 and June 2024. The wards with the highest NEET rates at the end of July 2024 are Waltham Cross (Broxbourne) 18.3%, Bedwell (Stevenage) 14.6%, Peartree (Welwyn Hatfield) 11.9% and Hatfield East (Welwyn Hatfield) 10.0%.
